The Mount Vernon Police Department currently has openings in the Retired Seniors Volunteer Program (R.S.V.P.).

R.S.V.P. volunteers go out in pairs one day a week for a two hour shift Monday through Friday. Volunteers drive a police department vehicle during their shift and provide security house checks as well as deliver inter office city mail.

Requirements to participate in the R.S.V.P program include completion of application, background check, interview and short field training process
