MOUNT VERNON—Councilmember Erin Moberg announced Wednesday evening that she is resigning from her position on city council.

The announcement was made at the end of a city council study session in which former councilmember Moberg indicated that recent news about her health has helped her to prioritize her family, her loved ones, and her health, at this time.

Mayor Boudreau, and all of Erin's fellow councilmembers took time to comment on how fortunate they felt to have worked with such a caring and competent city councilmember.

Erin was first appointed to her position by her fellow councilmembers in January 2019, to fill a vacancy. She then campaigned, and was officially elected by Mount Vernon residents in November 2019.

In the weeks ahead, City Council will announce plans to fill the vacant seat, which represents the residents of Ward 1.

"Erin has served this city with honor and a transparent commitment to make things better in Mount Vernon," Mayor Boudreau said. "We are truly grateful for her time and commitment to this council."
