THE CDBG SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT

A. NARRATIVE –The City of Mount Vernon is an Entitlement City in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. Public Notice and Public Hearings are required for substantial amendments to the Action Plan. A substantial amendment is required when proposed use of CDBG funds not previously identified/approved in the Consolidated Plan or Annual Action Plan; or a change in the allocation priorities or in the method of distribution of funds; or a change in the use of funds from one eligible activity to another that exceeds ten percent (10%) of the total current CDBG grant allocation.

The City of Mount Vernon is processing a substantial amendment is to reallocate unexpended funds from slow moving and/or completed projects. The substantial amendment is necessary so that the City can meet a statutorily required expenditure ratio as required by HUD. As per regulations, the City cannot have more than 1.5 times their annual CDBG grant allocation unexpended on May 2nd of each year. The objective of the Section 108 Loan Program is to systematically upgrade infrastructure and reduce flooding in the downtown area and to provide for the Library Commons Project.
